CEO Report 2014

2014 was another challenging but rewarding year for the ISPCA. Our National Cruelty Helpline received over 21,000 calls of which almost 4000 were allegations or reports of cruelty which were investigated by our Inspectors. Continuing problems with the over-production and over-population of dogs and equines kept our staff busy at our National Animal Centre in Co. Longford and our Equine Centre in Mallow, Co. Cork. Although the economy is improving, raising much needed funds remains challenging. This has been helped in 2014 by the appointment of a new Fundraising Manager and we are developing plans to invest in developing our fundraising team as we head into 2015.



2014 was an important year for the ISPCA and for animal welfare in Ireland with the introduction of the Animal Health and Welfare Act in March, legislation which the ISPCA had long been campaigning for. This new legislation is a significant step forward for animal welfare in Ireland and is already being put to good use by our Inspectors. In May, the ISPCA entered into a Service Agreement with the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM) which saw our Inspectors become Authorised Officers under the Act. Our Inspectors now have statutory powers of entry in some circumstances, can seize animals in some circumstances and can issue welfare improvement notices. Failure to comply with these notices is an offence. This has allowed our Inspectors to work more effectively and has resulted in a record year with over 700 animals being seized or surrendered including 439 dogs, 103 cats and over 100 equines. Other species seized or surrendered included swans, goats, hens and even a seal!

Most of the animals seized by our Inspectors were transported to our National Animal Centre in Co. Longford which admitted 459 dogs, 314 cats and over 50 horses, most of which have subsequently been rehomed. Our Equine Centre admitted 43 horses (40 now rehomed) and 17 donkeys and provided temporary accommodation for 161 dogs which were eventually transferred to Longford.

This fantastic animal welfare work can only be achieved through a motivated team of employees and volunteers and I'd like to thank each and every one of them for their hard work and dedication. We simply could not do what we do without them.

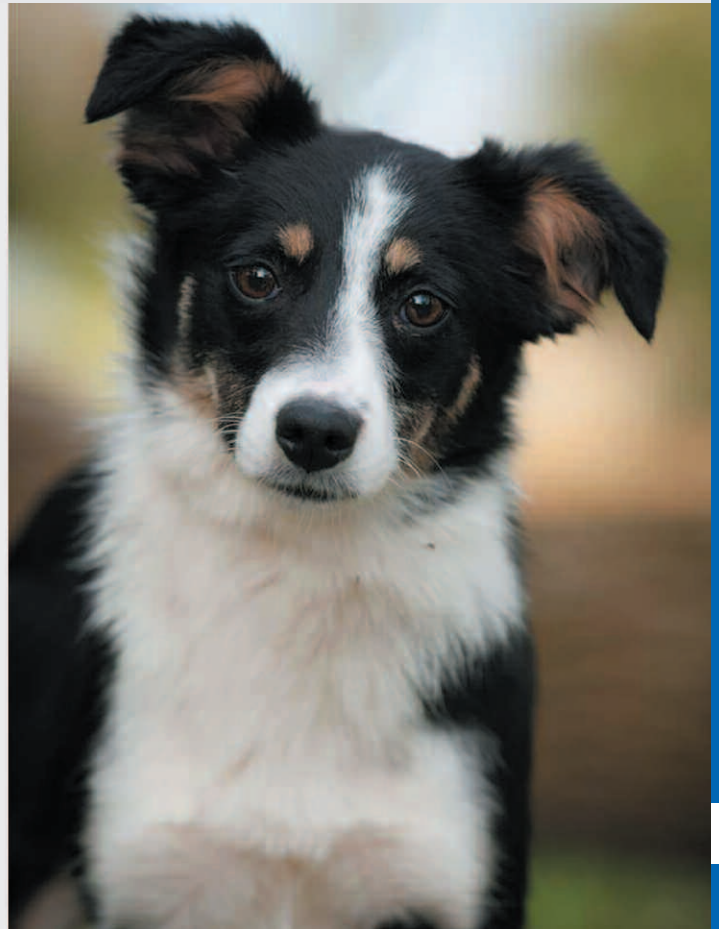
I joined the ISPCA as CEO in February 2014 and (at the point of writing, August 2015) have been with the Society for 18 months). I have had the benefit of a supportive management team and a supportive Board of Directors and I thank them for their support, particularly Chairperson Barbara Bent. In 2014, the ISPCA started developing, growing and looking to the future. We are currently developing a five year Strategic Plan which will provide a road map for the future work of the Society. From an animal welfare perspective we will be focussing on developing our Inspectorate and developing our education and advocacy work. In 2015, we recruited two new Inspectors and we published our first Inspectorate Report which highlighted prosecutions initiated by the ISPCA and finalised in court. We will also be developing our Equine Centre and National Animal Centre to allow us to maximise the potential to rescue, rehabilitate and rehome those animals in Ireland that are most in need: the neglected, abandoned and cruelly treated animals that have no voice of their own. The ISPCA will continue to provide that voice and will continue to work to achieve our objectives of preventing cruelty and alleviating suffering of animals all over Ireland.

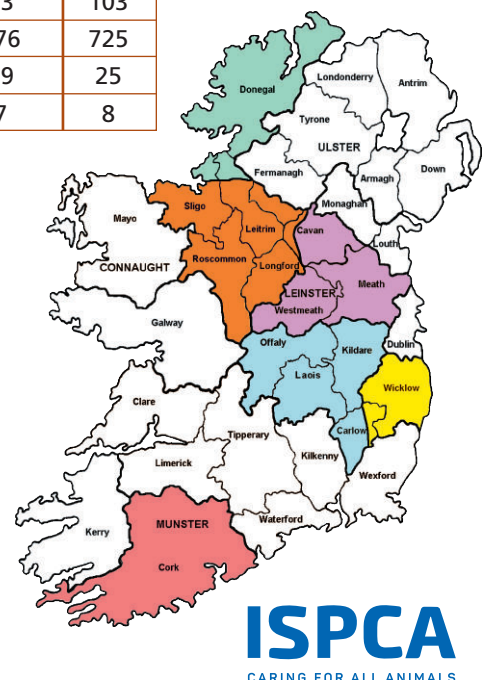

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF THE IRISH SOCIETY FOR THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS

We have audited the financial statements of The Irish Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals for the year ended 31 December 2014 set out on pages 8 to 25. These financial statements have been prepared under the accounting policies set out in the notes to the accounts.

This report is made solely to the charity's members, as a body, in accordance with Section 193 of the Companies Act 1963. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the charity's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the charity and its members, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinion we have formed.

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF DIRECTORS AND INDEPENDENT AUDITOR

The directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and the accounting standards issued by the Accounting Standards Board and promulgated by Chartered Accountants Ireland (Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in Ireland). Our responsibility is to audit and express an opinion on the financial statements in accordance with Irish Law and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland). Those standards require us to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors.
